# Important Points you should know about Public Sector Banks

### • RBI (Reserve Bank of India):

- o The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is India's central banking institution, which controls the monetary policy of the Indian rupee. It was established on **1st April 1935** during the British Raj in accordance with the provisions of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934
- o Governor : Raghuram Rajan
- o **Headquarters**: Mumbai

### State Bank of India

- o It the largest banking and financial services company in India by assets. The bank traces its ancestry to British India, through the Imperial Bank of India, to the founding in 1806 of the Bank of Calcutta, making it the oldest commercial bank in the Indian Subcontinent. Bank of Madras merged into the other two presidency banks Bank of Calcutta and Bank of Bombay to form the Imperial Bank of India, which in turn became the State Bank of India. Government of India nationalized the Imperial Bank of India in 1956, with Reserve Bank of India taking a 60% stake, and renamed it the State Bank of India. In 2008, the government took over the stake held by the Reserve Bank of India.

- o **Associate Banks :** SBI has five associate banks; all use the State Bank of India logo, which is a blue circle, and all use the "State Bank of" name, followed by the regional headquarters' name:
  - State Bank of Bikaner & Jaipur
  - State Bank of Hyderabad
  - State Bank of Mysore
  - State Bank of Patiala
  - State Bank of Travancore
  - Note: Earlier SBI had seven associate banks. State Bank of Saurashtra and State Bank of Indore merged with SBI on 13 August 2008 and 19 June 2009 respectively.

# Allahabad Bank

- This is the oldest joint stock bank in India. The bank was founded in Allahabad in 1865.
- o **CMD**: S. A. Phanse
- Headquarters : Kolkatha

#### Andhra Bank

- o Founded by Bhogaraju Pattabhi Seetha Rammaiah in 20 November 1923.
- o CMD: No CMD at present. The CMD B. A. Prabhakar resigned on 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2013.
- o **Headquarters**: Hyderabad

# • Bank of Baroda

- o Founded by Maharaja Sayajirao Gaekwad on 20<sup>th</sup> July 1908. It is the second largest Bank in India after State Bank of India. In addition to its headquarters in its home state of Gujarat, it has a corporate headquarters in the Bandra Kurla Complex in Mumbai.
- o CMD: S. Mundra
- o **Headquarters**: Vadodara (Baroda)

# • Bank of India

- Founded in 7th September 1906. It is India's 4th largest PSU bank, after State Bank of India, Punjab National Bank and Bank of Baroda.
- o **CMD**: V. R. Iyer (Vijayalakshmi R Iye)
- Headquarters : Mumbai



#### Bank of Maharashtra

- The Bank was founded by a group of visionaries led by the late V. G. Kale and the late D. K. Sathe and registered as a Banking Company 16 September 1935 with an authorized capital of INR1 million. It commenced business on 8 February 1936.
- o **CMD**: No CMD at present. The CMD Narendra Singh end his tenure on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2013.
- o **Headquarters**: Pune

# Bharativa Mahila Bank

- o This is the first all women bank of India established on 19 November 2013. As this is the newly born bank you have maximum chances to get a question about this bank. So we have made a separate and detailed post about the important points of this bank next to this article.
- o CMD: Usha Ananthasubramanian
- o **Headquarters**: New Delhi

# Canara Bank

- o It was established in 1906, making it one of the oldest banks in the country. The bank was nationalised in 1969. Today, Canara Bank occupies a premier position in the comity of Indian banks with an unbroken record of profits since its inception.
- o C MD: R. K. Dubey (Rajiv Kishore Dubey)
- o **Headquarters**: Bangalore

#### **Central Bank of India**

- o It is is one of the oldest and largest commercial banks in India. Established in 21st December 1911.
- o CMD: Rajeev Rishi
- o **Headquarters**: Mumbai

# **Corporation Bank**

- o It is a public sector banking company headquartered in Mangalore, India. The bank has pan-India presence with 6,677 functional units comprising 1869 branches, 1425 ATMs & 3545 branchless banking units as of 31st March 2013.
- o CMD: Sadhuram Bansal
- o **Headquarters**: Mangalore (Karnataka)

#### Dena Bank

- o It is one of the earliest banks in India, headquartered in Mumbai. Dena Bank was founded on 26<sup>th</sup> May 1938, by the family of Devkaran Nanjee under the name Devkaran Nanjee Banking Company Ltd. Later it has shortened to De Na bank.
- o CMD: Ashwini Kumar
- o **Headquarters**: Mumbai

#### **Indian Bank**

- o It is one of the big public sector banks of India. It has overseas branches in Colombo, Jaffna, Sri Lanka, Singapore, and 229 correspondent banks in 69 countries. Since 1969 the Government of India has owned the bank, which celebrated its centenary in 2007. It was founded in 1907.
- o **CMD**: T. M. Bashin
- o Headquarters: Chennai

# **Indian Overseas Bank**

- o It was established in 10<sup>th</sup> February 1937. It is one of the banks that the Govt. of India has approved for online payment of taxes. The bank's business more than doubled in the last four years.
- o CMD: M. Narendra
- o Headquarters: Chennai
- **Oriental Bank of Commerce**



- o It is an India-based bank established in Lahore (then a city of British India, and currently in Pakistan), is one of the public sector banks in India. It was founded in 19<sup>th</sup> February 1943.
- o **CMD**: S. L. Bansal
- o **Headquarters**: Gurgaon

# Punjab and Sindh Bank

- o It is a major Public Sector bank in Northern India and working 100% on CBS platform. The banks government shareholding is 79.86%. It is giving highest rate of interest on fixed deposits for senior citizens.
- o CMD: D. P. Singh
- o **Headquarters**: New Delhi

# Punjab National Bank

- o It is the third largest bank in India in terms of asset size. It was founded in 1895 as a private banking company by Lala Lajpat Rai and is currently the second largest state-owned commercial bank in India ahead of Bank of Baroda with about 5000 branches across 764 cities. The bank has been ranked 248th biggest bank in the world by the Bankers' Almanac.
- o CMD: K. R. Kamath
- o **Headquarters**: New Delhi

# • Syndicate Bank

- o It is one of the oldest and major commercial banks of India. It was founded in 1925 by T M A Pai, Upendra Pai and Vaman Kudva. At the time of its establishment, the bank was known as Canara Industrial and Banking Syndicate Limited. The bank, along with 13 major commercial banks of India, was nationalised on 19 July 1969.
- CMD: Sudhir Kumar JainHeadquarters: Manipal

#### UCO Bank

- o It was formerly United Commercial Bank, established in 6<sup>th</sup> January 1943 in Kolkata, is one of the oldest and major commercial banks of India. Ghanshyam Das Birla, an eminent Indian industrialist, during the Quit India movement of 1942, had conceived the idea of organizing a commercial bank with Indian capital and management, and the United Commercial Bank Limited was incorporated to give shape to that idea. The Bank was started with Kolkata as its Head Office with an issued capital of INR2 crores and a paid-up capital of INR1 crore. The bank, along with 13 major commercial banks of India, was nationalised on 19 July 1969 by the Government of India. Its name was changed to UCO Bank, in 1985, by an act of Indian Parliament as a bank in Bangladesh existed with the name "United Commercial Bank" which caused confusion in the international banking arena.

#### Union Bank of India

- o UBI was registered on 11 November 1919 as a limited company in Mumbai and was inaugurated by Mahatma Gandhi. It is one of the largest public sector banks of India (the government owns 55.43% of its share capital remains public, private organisations and foreign companies), is listed on the Forbes 2000. It is active in promoting financial inclusion policy and is a member of the Alliance for Financial Inclusion (AFI).
- o CMD: D. Sarkar
- o **Headquarters**: Mumbai

#### United Bank of India

UBI was the result of the merger in 1950 of four Bengali banks: Comilla Banking Corporation (founded by Narendra Chandra Dutta in 1914 in what is now Bangladesh), Bengal Central Bank



(founded by Sri J.C. Das in 1918), Comilla Union Bank (founded by Sri L.B. Dutta in 1922) and Hooghly Bank (founded by Sri D.N. Mukherjeee 1932).

o CMD: Smt. Archana Bhargava

o Headquarters: Kolkata

# Vijaya Bank

- o It was established by Shri. Attavara Balakrishna Shetty at Bunts Hostel in Mangalore on October 23, 1931. Since it was established on Vijayadashami Day, it was named 'Vijaya Bank. The objective was to promote banking habits, thrift and entrepreneurship among the farming community of Dakshina Kannada district in Karnataka State. The bank became a scheduled bank in 1958. Vijaya Bank steadily grew into a large All India bank, with nine smaller banks merging with it during 1963-68. The bank was nationalised on April 15, 1980.
- o **CMD**: H.S. Upendra Kamath
- o **Headquarters**: Bangalore

#### IDBI Bank

- o It is an Indian financial service company headquartered Mumbai, India. RBI categorized IDBI as an "other public sector bank". It was established in 1964 by an Act of Parliament to provide credit and other facilities for the development of the fledgling Indian industry. It is currently 10th largest development bank in the world in terms of reach with 1945 ATMs, 1159 branches including one overseas branch at DIFC, Dubai and 779 centers including two overseas centers at Singapore & Beijing. Some of the institutions built by IDBI are the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI), National Stock Exchange of India (NSE), the National Securities Depository Limited (NSDL), the Stock Holding Corporation of India Limited (SHCIL), the Credit Analysis & Research Ltd, the Exim Bank (India), the Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI), the Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India, and IDBI Bank, which is owned by the Indian Government. IDBI Bank is on a par with nationalized banks and the SBI Group as far as government ownership is concerned.

# Important Points you should know about Bharatiya Mahil a Bank

On the Birth Day of Indira Gandhi (19th November 2013) our Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh and UPA Chairperson Sonia Gandhi have launched the Bharatiya Mahila Bank (First Ever Women Bank in India), an initiative aimed at economically empowering millions of women across the country who do not have access to basic financial services such as bank accounts or loans. As this is an important event, you may get a question from this. So, here are some important points you should know about Bharatiya Mahila Bank.

- It is first ever women bank
- Tagline "Empowering Women, Empowering India".
- In the Budget speech of 2012-13, Mr Chidambaram had announced a sum of Rs. 1,000 crore as the seed capital for the establishment of the Bharatiya Mahila Bank.
- The Reserve Bank of India gave its in-principal approval for the Bharatiya Mahila Bank in June after which the banking company was set up.
- Headquartered in Delhi, the government has targeted setting up of 25 such branches across the country by March 31, 2014.
- Seven branches became operational across the country. Those are Mumbai, Kolkatha, Chennai, Gowhati, Bangalore, Jaipur and Lucknow. The government had also proposed opening of branches in



- Delhi and Indore, but inauguration of these branches was disallowed by the Election Commission because of elections in these states.
- Usha Ananthasubramanian is the bank's CMD. In a career spanning over 31 years, Ms Ananthasubramanian has worked in various positions in the banking and allied areas. Before joining BMB, she was an executive director with state-run Punjab National Bank (PNB).
- The bank will have 39 branches (including mobile and satellite branches) and 127 ATMs by the end of the first year of its operations. It will reportedly have 33,299 customer accounts by the end of the first year.
- Maximum of the employees of the bank will be women. The bank has already recruited 103 candidates as POs. Around 36 per cent of the successful candidates are men.
- The bank will help impriving the ratio of women employees in banking sector. Present ratio of women in banking sector of india is only 20%.

he Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on **29th October 2013** released the Second Quarter Review of Monetary Policy 2013-14. According the released statement by the RBI, the **Repo rate increased by 25 basis** points from **7.5** percent to **7.75** percent.

# The highlights of the Second Quarter Review of Monetary Policy 2013-14 are

- 1. RBI reduced the marginal standing facility (MSF) rate by 25 basis points from 9.0 percent to 8.75 percent with immediate effect.
- 2. RBI also increased the policy reporate under the liquidity adjustment facility (LAF) by 25 basis points from 7.5 percent to 7.75 percent with immediate effect.

- 3. The liquidity provided through term repos of 7-day and 14-day tenor has been increased from 0.25 percent of net demand and time liabilities (NDTL) of the banking system to 0.5 percent with immediate effect.
- 4. Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR) unchanged at 4 Percent
- 5. Repo rate hiked due to upturn of inflation and other factors. 6) RBI downward FY14 GDP growth to 5 percent from 5.7 percent.

# Explanations

#### Bank Rate

Bank rate, also referred to as the discount rate, is the rate of interest which a central bank charges on the loans and advances that it extends to commercial banks and other financial intermediaries. Changes in the bank rate are often used by central banks to control the money supply.

# Repo Rate

Repo rate is the rate at which our banks borrow rupees from RBI. Whenever the banks have any shortage of funds they can borrow it from RBI. A reduction in the repo rate will help banks to get money at a cheaper rate. When the repo rate increases, borrowing from RBI becomes more expensive.

#### Reverse Repo Rate

This is exact opposite of Repo rate. Reverse Repo rate is the rate at which Reserve Bank of India (RBI) borrows money from banks. RBI uses this tool when it

system. Banks are always happy to lend money to RBI since their money is in safe hands with a good interest. An increase in Reverse repo rate can cause the banks to transfer more funds to RBI due to this attractive interest rates.

#### **CRR**

Cash reserve Ratio (CRR) is the amount of funds that the banks have to keep with RBI. If RBI decides to increase the percent of this, the available amount with the banks comes down. RBI is using this method (increase of CRR rate), to drain out the excessive money from the banks.

#### SLR

SLR (Statutory Liquidity Ratio) is the amount a commercial bank needs to maintain in the form of cash, or gold or govt. approved securities (Bonds) before providing credit to its customers. SLR rate is  $\stackrel{\sim}{\sim}$ determined and maintained by the RBI (Reserve Bank of India) in order to control the expansion of bank credit. SLR is determined as the percentage of total feels there is too much money floating in the banking demand and percentage of time liabilities. Time

Liabilities are the liabilities a commercial bank liable Marginal Standing Facility (MSF) to pay to the customers on their anytime demand. SLR is used to control inflation and propel growth. Through SLR rate tuning the money supply in the system can be controlled efficiently.

Marginal Standing Facility (MSF) is the rate at which scheduled banks could borrow funds overnight from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) against approved government securities. The basic difference between Repo and MSF scheme is that in MSF banks can use the securities under SLR to get loans from RBI and hence MSF rate is 1% more than repo rate.

Ctock Exchange: Stock Exchange acts as a market place where new shares are issued to public by corporates and Dexisting shares are bought and sold by public. Primary and Secondary market activities are carried out through stock exchanges. The members of the exchange may trade on their own or as brokers on behalf of others. There are a number of stock exchanges in the world. Based market capitalization factor the top 10 stock exchanges are,

- 1. New York Stock Exchange: This is located in the most famous Wall street, New York and it was established in the year of 1792.
- 2. NASDAQ Stock Exchange: This stock exchange was constituted in the year of 1971. This is the second largest stock exchange in North America. NASDAQ stands for National Association of Securities Dealers Automated Quotations. This stock exchange is maintained by NASDAQ OMX group.
- 3. Tokyo Stock Exchange: TSE is the third largest stock exchange all over the world and first largest stock exchange among the Asian countries. It was created in the year of 1878.
- **London Stock Exchange:** This is the oldest stock exchange in the world which was established in the year of 1801. This is the real international market in which nearly 3,000 companies from 70 different countries are listed.
- 5. Hong Kong Stock Exchange: This is the largest stock exchange in China. Initially It was named Association of Brokers, Hong Kong in 1891 but later it was renamed as Hong Kong stock exchange in 1914.



- 6. **Shanghai Stock Exchange:** This is the third largest stock exchange in the Asian continent and second largest in the People Republic of China. Formed in the year of 1990 and these organizations are not entirely open to the foreign investors and there are strict regulations issued by China Securities Regulatory Commission.
- 7. **Toronto Stock Exchange :** Toronto Stock Exchange is maintained by TMX group of Canada. It is located at Toronto, Canada. This is the first stock exchange of Canada and was formed in the year of 1852 by the Association of the Brokers of that country and later on they grew into the seventh largest stock exchange in the world. This is one of the largest stock exchanges in the world. This is the third largest stock exchange in North America. Various companies in Europe, Canada and United States are listed in this stock exchange. They are the leader in the mining and oil sector.
- 8. **Deutsche Borse Stock Exchange :** This was formed in the year of 1994. This is the stock exchange of Germany located at Frankfurt. This is one of the few stock exchanges which involves in charity organizations.
- 9. **Australian Securities Exchange :** The first stock market of Australia was formed in the year of 1861 at Melbourne. Then it underwent numerous changes throughout the 19th century. Finally Australian Securities Exchange was created in the year of 2006 by the merger of Australian Stock Exchange and Sydney Future Exchange.
- 10. **Bombay Stock Exchange :** This is one of the oldest stock exchanges in the world. It was formed in the year of 1850. Till 1874, the trading took place under the banyan tree on Mahatma Gandhi road, Mumbai. Then it was shifted to the Dalal Street (Broker's street). Till 2002, it was known as The Stock Exchange, Bombay. Then it was renamed as BSE. Apart from BSE, other important stock exchange of India is National Stock Exchange which was formed in the year of 1994. Recently BSE is published as a company in the stock exchange. Currently the market capitalization of BSE is 1,263 Billion dollars and the market operates between 9.15 am and 3.30 pm

- The 1,337 kg Mars Orbiter Satellite will be put into a 250 km X 23,500 km elliptical orbit.
- The launch vehicle being used is a PSLV-C25.
- This is the 25th mission of PSLV and fifth in the XL configuration.
- Time from launch to injection of the Orbiter into its trajectory is about 40 minutes.
- The cost of the mission is approximately Rs. 450 crore.
- With this mission, India will be the first Asian country and the fourth in the world to take part in interplanetary exploration.

# Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment **Guarantee Act (MGNREGA)**

It's been launched in 2006 as NREGA and renamed as MGNREGA on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2009. Its intended to provide 100 days of employment to rural adult households as a right.

# Swarnajayanthi Gram Swarojgar Yojna (SGSY)

It aims at providing self-employment to the rural poor by organizing them into self -help groups (SHGs). It's been launched on April 1st 1999.

# Pradhanmantri Gram SadakYojna (PMGSY)

PradhanMantri Gram SadakYojana (PMGSY) was launched on 25th December 2000 as a fully funded Centrally Sponsored Scheme to provide all weather road connectivity in rural areas of the country.

#### Indira AwaasYojna (IAY)

The objective of the scheme is to primarily help the weaker sections in rural areas who belong to Below Poverty Line (BPL) category by granting financial assistance for construction of a pucca house. Additional assistance will be provided for sanitary latrine and smokeless challah under Total Sanitation Programme (TSP)and Rajiv Gandhi GraminVidyudeekaranYojna. E This scheme is operational since 1985.

#### **Bharath Nirman**

It's been launched in 2005 to provide basic infrastructure in rural areas. Six components of this programme include

- Road connectivity
- Electrification
- Drinking water supply in rural areas



- Telephone connectivity
- Housing
- Irrigation

It's based on PURA (Providing Urban Amenities in Rural Areas) model of Dr. Abdul Kalam. 1st phase of the programme has been completed in 2009 and second phase is being operational now.

# Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM)

Launched in 2005 for modernisation of urban centres

# Swarna Jayanti Shahari RojgarYojana (SJSRY)

Launched in 1997 (revamped in 2007) to provide selfemployment and wage employment to urban poor with special attention to women.

# **Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS)**

Launched in 1975, to alleviate problem of mal nutrition among children of age group 6 months or below and their mothers.

#### **National Rural Health Mission (NRHM)**

Originally launched for a period of 7 years (2005-12). It's intended to provide health care facilities in rural areas. JananiSurakshaYojna is part of this programme.

#### Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Scheme

This scheme is intended to provide pension of Rs. 200 to the poor above the age of 65 years. Its been revised and renamed on 19<sup>th</sup> November 2007.

# Rashtriya swasthya bima yojna (National health insurance programme)

Launched in 2008, to provide health insurance facility to people of below poverty line.

Rural Group Life Insurance Scheme: The scheme would cover people below the poerty line. In this unprecedented scheme, every poor man in a villiage would get a life insurance. Half of the premium amount is to be paid by the State and the rest by the villiagers. Families of the insured poor man would get Rs. 5000 in case of a natural death and double this for an unnatural one.

Launched to meet the challenge of climate change and to achieve sustainable energy. It's aimed to achieve 20,000 MW of solar power by 2022.

# **Nobel Prize winners List 2013**

**Brief History:** On 27 November 1895, Alfred Nobel signed his last will and testament, giving the largest share of his fortune to a series of prizes in Physics, Chemistry, Physiology or Medicine, Literature and Peace – the Nobel Prizes. In 1968, Sveriges Riksbank (Sweden's central bank) established The Sveriges Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel.

At the Nobel Prize Award Ceremonies on 10 December the Nobel Laureates receive three things: a Nobel Diploma, a Nobel Medal and a document confirming the Nobel Prize amount. Each Nobel Diploma is a unique work of art, created by foremost Swedish and Norwegian artists and calligraphers. The Nobel Medals are handmade with careful precision and in 18 carat green gold plated with 24 carat gold.

The Nobel Medals in Physics, Chemistry, Physiology or Medicine and Literature are identical on the face: it shows the image of Alfred Nobel and the years of his birth and death (1833-1896). Nobel's portrait also appears on the Nobel Peace Prize Medal and the Medal for the Prize in Economic Sciences, but with a slightly different design. The image on the reverse varies according to the institution awarding the prize.

- The Nobel Prize in Physics 2013 The Nobel Prize in Physics 2013 was awarded jointly to Francois Englert (Belgium) and Peter W. Higgs (Britain) for the theoretical discovery of a mechanism that contributes to our understanding of the origin of mass of subatomic particles, and which recently was confirmed through the discovery of the predicted fundamental particle, by the ATLAS and CMS experiments at CERN's Large Hadron Collider.
- The Nobel Prize in Chemistry 2013 The Nobel prize in chemistry was jointly to Martin Karplus (Harvard University), Michael Levitt (Stanford School of Medicine) and Arieh Warshel (University of Southern California) for "for the development of multiscale models for complex chemical systems".
- The Nobel Prize in Literature 2013 Alice Munro (Canada) won the Nobel Prize for Literature for her tales of the struggles, loves and tragedies of women in small-town Canada that made her what the award-giving committee called the "master of the contemporary short story."
- The Nobel Peace Prize 2013 Nobel Peace Prize for 2013 is to be awarded to the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW) "for its extensive efforts to eliminate chemical weapons."
- 2013 Prize in Economic Sciences The 2013 Sveriges Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel was awarded jointly to Eugene F. Fama (USA), Lars Peter Hansen (USA) and Robert J. Shiller (USA) "for their empirical analysis of asset prices".

- **Irani Trophy :** The Irani Cup (earlier called Irani Trophy) tournament was conceived during the 1959-60 season to mark the completion of 25 years of the Ranji Trophy championship.

- **Duleep Trophy**: A domestic first-class cricket competition played in India between teams representing geographical zones of India. The competition is named after Kumar Shri Duleepsinhji (also known as "Duleep").

- **Deodhar Trophy:** List A cricket competition in Indian domestic cricket.
  - o Recent winner North Zone (2010-11) won the tournament a record 13 times
- **Vijay Hazare trophy**: Also known as the Ranji One Day Trophy, was started in 2002–03 as a limited-over domestic competition involving state teams from the Ranji Trophy plates. It is named after the famous Indian cricketer Vijay Hazare.

- **NKP Salve Challenger Trophy:** The NKP Salve Challenger Trophy, commonly referred to as the Challenger Trophy, is an Indian List A cricket tournament organized by the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI). Established in the 1994–1995 season.
  - o Recent winner India Blue(2013-14)
- Colonel C. K. Nayudu trophy: Named after BCCI Ex Chairman C. K. Naidu.
  - o Recent winner Mumbai
- Indian Premier League (IPL): This is a Twenty20 cricket championship league in India. It was initiated by Lalit Modi and the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), after an altercation between the BCCI and the Indian Cricket League. The league is headquartered in Mumbai, and is currently supervised by BCCI Vice-President Ranjib Biswal, serves as the league's chairman and Commissioner. It is contested by nine teams as of 2013, consisting of players from around the cricketing world.
  - o Recent IPL (6<sup>th</sup> Season) Winners are Mumbai Indians.
- **Border–Gavaskar Trophy:** This is a Test cricket series, played between India and Australia. The series is named after Australia's Allan Border and India's Sunil Gavaskar, who both scored over 10,000 Test runs in their career and captained their respective teams and were the original world record holders for most runs scored in Test match cricket. Started in 1996-97.
  - o Recent Winners: India (2012-2013)

#### **International Cricket Tournaments:**



- **ICC World Cup:** This is the international championship of One Day International (ODI) cricket. The event is organised by the sport's governing body, the International Cricket Council (ICC), with preliminary qualification rounds leading up to a finals tournament which is held every four years.
  - o Recent Winner: India (2011) Hosts India, Srilanka and Bangladesh
  - o Next World Cup 2015 (Australia and New Zealand)
- T 20 World Cup: Also referred to as the ICC World T20 or the T20 World Cup. This is the international championship of Twenty20 cricket. Organized by cricket's governing body, the International Cricket Council (ICC), the tournament consists of 12 teams, comprising all ten ICC full members and two other ICC members chosen through the ICC World Twenty20 Qualifier. The event is generally held every two years, and all matches are accorded Twenty20 International status.
  - o Recent winner: West Indies
- Champions League T 20: Also referred to as the CLT20, is an annual international Twenty20 cricket competition played between the top domestic teams from major cricketing nations. The competition was launched in 2008 with the first edition held in October 2009. It is jointly owned by the BCCI, Cricket Australia and Cricket South Africa, and is chaired by N. Srinivasan, who is also the president of the BCCI.
  - o Recent Winners: Mumbai Indians (2013)
- **ICC Champions Trophy**: One Day International (ODI) cricket tournament organised by the International Cricket Council (ICC), second in importance only to the Cricket World Cup. It was inaugurated as the ICC Knock Out Tournament in 1998 and has been played approximately every two years since, its name was changed to the Champions Trophy in 2002.
  - o Recent winners: India (2013)
- **Asia Cup:** An international men's One Day International cricket tournament. It was established in 1983 when the Asian Cricket Council was founded as a measure to promote goodwill between Asian countries.
  - o Recent winner Pakisthan (2012)
- **Ashes**: A notional prize in Test cricket series played between England and Australia. The Ashes are regarded as being held by the team that won the last Test series between those sides, or if that series was drawn, by the team that last won such a series.
